

## **ANNUAL DAY REPORT 2019 - 2020**

In the words of Helen Keller – “The best and most beautiful things in the world cannot be seen or touched but felt in the heart”.

At the very outset, I am happy to present the Annual Report of the academic session 2019 – 2020.

As a regular practice followed every year, this session began with the Orientation Programme for the parents of the students of classes Pre-Primary to XI. The programme made the parents aware of the scheme of education we impart here at our school.

We are happy to inform that we have received the Best Infrastructure School Award for the year 2019 – 20 in the survey conducted by Nav Bharat. Also, our Parent Body has been conferred with National K – 12 School Chain 2019 by Indian Education Congress, our school has been listed in the Forbes India Marque as Great Place to study and Leading Brand of the year K – 12 2019 schools by WCRC.

This Academic year started with great zeal and enthusiasm under the leadership of our Business and Academic Heads – Mr Raju Babu Sinha sir and Ms Priya Gopal madam. The year witnessed yet another spectrum of training programs and orientation for staff in the month of June that lasted for almost 7 days. The training focused not only on Academics but stressed on the trainings related to Child Safety i.e POCSSO, Inclusive Education and Gender Sensitivity. And round the year, our teachers have been attending various training sessions conducted by CBSE.

The results of CBSE Grade X were overwhelming. Our students of grade X brought laurels to the school. Ms. Kanchi Katwani scored 96%. Ms Anisha Gotmare scored 95.4% and Ms. Arsha Ghedu scored 94.4%

We have the best teaching faculty in the campus. This fact is quite evident from the teachers of Grade X who put their rigorous efforts in teaching, coaching and mentoring. The parents too were very happy to see the expected output from their wards. They expressed their gratitude towards all the staff members and applauded the nurturing that the school environment created and the involvement and enthusiasm shown by the teachers and the management of the school.

In the month of August we had the School Inspection by CBSE and I am happy to share that our school is now upgraded to grade XII by CBSE and we shall have our first batch of grade XII appearing at the AISSSE in 2022.

This year we have a committed band of 40 teachers with 5 coordinators, 30 administrative staff and the Supportive staff, 30 Transportation Staff who are committed and are the spirit behind the institution.

**INVESTITURE CEREMONY:** We witnessed elections for the school council and the house captains with a touch of authentic election process – campaigns, secret ballot and voting.

Apart from this we have student representatives for various committees – CCA committee, Cultural committee, Event committee, Sports committee.

### **Sports and Games**

Our School showed admirable commitment in sports and games. In keeping up the tradition of Mount Litera Zee School, our students upheld the records. We were happy to have our physical education teacher Ms. Kiran. We were also blessed with the coaches Mr. Prashant - Karate Coach, Mr Prafful- Cricket Coach, Mr Sujit - Foot Ball Coach, Mr Mohan - Lawn Tennis Coach and Mr Ayush Meshram- Skating Coach. They were indeed very active.

Through their timely guidance and effective coaching , our students outshone in the sports events conducted by various associations at various levels.

In under – 17 State level Hasti Chashak Tennis Ball Cricket Competition conducted by Maharashtra Tennis Ball Cricket Association, our boys played well and stood runners - Up.

Falguni Satpaise and Lokesh Satpaise won gold medals in the under 11 and under 14, Inter-school Skating competitions conducted by St Vincent Palloti School and Delhi Public School.

At the same time, Falguni Satpaise and Lokesh Satpaise participated in the District Level Skating competition conducted by DSO and won Silver and Bronze medals respectively and were qualified for the Divisional Level Competition.

Falguni Satpaise and Lokesh Satpaise participated at the RSFI National Level Skating Competition organized by The Roller Skating Federation of India.

In under-17 carrom competition conducted by DSO, Aditya Singh and Diya Wandre competed well enough at district level and qualified for division level.

In under-14 Karate competition organised by DSO, Yashaswi Assudani competed at Taluka Level and qualified for District Level. At the same time, in under -17 Karate, Shriya Bhargavi and Samruddhi Verma competed at Taluka level and qualified for District level.

Following were the students who bagged medals in various categories in the inter-school competitions:

- In under 9 years, Masil Tembhone won Gold medal and Bronze medal in the competitions that were conducted at Delhi Public School and St Vincent Palloti School. Rofi Khan won Bronze medal in the competition conducted at Centre Point School.
- In under 11 years, Kartik Tarar won Silver medal in the competition that was conducted at Delhi Public School, Manan Sharma won Bronze medal in the competition that was conducted at Centre Point School.

In the Inter-school Karate competition conducted by All India Open Karate Association, Swayan Chawla stood in 2<sup>nd</sup> position and Surbhi Khadatkhar stood in the 3<sup>rd</sup> position in the under 14 years category.

In under 12 category, Annuttar Narnavre stood in the 2<sup>nd</sup> position in the 100mts Inter school Athletic competition conducted by Lokmat Campus Club.

**World wisdom Quiz:** Athang Shambharkar of grade IV, Vidhit Kandru of grade VI, Tanmay Shastri of grade IV and Md. Rushan Sheikh of grade VI qualified for the Final Round of Wild Wisdom Quiz that was held at Mumbai.

**CCA:** We have students with varied talents, abilities and interest buried deep within. To unfold them and blossom to the optimum level, the institution offers ample opportunities through co-curricular and extracurricular activities. The students are expected and encouraged to make the best use of them and benefit a lot from them.

### **Fame & Glory**

We at MLZS provide various opportunities to explore the talent within self. In the row, this year we had given various opportunities to kids to shine in the fields of Dance, Singing and Modeling. Fame and Glory had conducted auditions in our premises in the month of September for students of grades I to VIII. The selected students were further groomed by Fame & Glory Entertainment for the final round.

Our students participated in various events and emerged as winners in some categories. Chhanak Bhingardive of grade V A emerged as the winner in Modeling, Awantika Wankhede was judged for her Best Attitude, in dance competition Yashasvi Assudani stood in 1<sup>st</sup> place in the senior category and Beepanpreet Kaur stood in 1<sup>st</sup> place in the junior category.

**Counseling service** is provided to the students to cope up with the academic and other emotional problems. Counseling is specially given to the students who face learning difficulties. We are very grateful to have Ms. Mehzareen for her painstaking services rendered to our students.

**OLYMPIADS:** The School also conducted various external examinations such as National Cyber Olympiad, Science Olympiad Foundation, International Mathematics Olympiad, Silver Zone Olympiad, Maharashtra Talent Search Examination and Geo Genius in which more than 300 students participated from various classes.

In the Olympiads conducted by Silver Zone, our students did their level best and some of them were qualified for the 2<sup>nd</sup> round.

In GK Olympiad, Prince Nagale of I C, Om Hukare of II C, Brahmani Nagpure of III B, Vidhi Pangal of IV A won Gold medals. Yash Disawal of II A and Syed Faizur Rahman of III B won Silver medals. Chhanchit Khadse of II C and Kartik Khatwani of III B won Bronze medals.

In English Olympiad, Syed Faizur Rahman of III B, Hrudul Paunikar of IV B and Jayarth Singh Rajput of V A won Gold medals.

In Science Olympiad, Tanvi Karande of II C, Syed Faizur Rahman of III B, Vidhi Pangal of IV A and Sahil Rahate of IX A won Gold medals.

In Math Olympiad quite a number of students won medals. Veronika of I A, Anwita Agarwal of II A, Kanishka Sadnani of II B, Om Hukare of II C, Ruchi Kumari of III A, Anchal Pali of III B, Athang Shambarkar of IV B, Arnav of V A, Mahak of V B, Saumya of VI A and Pruthvi of VII won Gold medals. SuchiKumari of I B, MdKaunian Sheik of II A, Aqsa Shams of II C, Palak Singh of III A, Syed Faizur Rahamn of III B, Aradhya Gupta of IV B, Qiestas Khan of V A, and Manan Sharma of VI B won Silver medals.

Arjan Singh Bhatia of I B, Abdul Ahmad Nagani of II A, Ayan Sangole of II C, Harisha Chawan of III A, Md Asad Ansaru of III B, Ditisha Mulchandani of IV B, Priyanshi Chandanani of V A, Md Rushan Ahmad of VI B won Bronze medals.

I am glad to share that some of our students have been qualified for the 2<sup>nd</sup> level of Math Olympiad –Anchal Pali of III B, Athang Shambharkar of IV B and Saumya Janbandhu of VI A.

**SCIENCE EXHIBITIONS:**

To explore and encourage scientific and technological talent among the young generation, to promote creative thinking among children through self-devised science projects and to bring out the future scientists into lime light who may then be trained as proficient inventors for the growth of the society, our students were encouraged to participate at the Inter-school Science Exhibition held at School of Home Science, Kamptee and Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Nandanvan, Nagpur in the months of December and January. Students prepared various models based on Smart Home, Smart City, Fire Alarm, Vending Machine, Agricultural Technology and Management of Natural Resources.

### **PLANETARIUM SHOW:**

To help students connect with the night sky and to make them understand about various Astronomy Sky simulation Scenarios, Blue Star Planetarium conducted a Planetarium show in our school on 27th November 2019.

### **Educational Trips:**

Educational tours provide students with a great opportunity to learn in an informal environment, while building long-lasting relationships with other students and teachers. Keeping this in mind we had planned one day trips to Dwaraka Park and Fun n Food Village and a 5 day trip to Mysore and Bangaluru.

**FIT INDIA MOVEMENT:** For any Society or Nation to progress, it's important that their citizens are fit. Fit children are able to handle day – to – day physical and emotional challenges better. However, for a holistic and intrinsically healthy life style, awareness and support for fitness movement is more essential.

On 29<sup>th</sup> August, 2019, the Honorable Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modiji launched a Nationwide, "FIT INDIA" movement that aimed to encourage people to inculcate physical activity and sports in their everyday lives and daily routine.

So as to take this mission forward, CBSE decided to have FITNESS WEEK celebrated in all its affiliated schools. We too at Mount Litera Zee School celebrated FIT INDIA week from 27<sup>th</sup> November to 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2019. Our students participated in Dumbbells, Yoga, Meditation, Aerobics, Zumba Dance, Martial Arts, and traditional games like Pakadam Pakadai, Chain-Game, Hop-Scotch, Rope-Skipping, Rumal-Chori and Seven-tiles. In addition to this, students participated in Essay Writing, Slogan Making, Poster making and Quiz competitions.

**SEMINARS:** This year we had a varied range of seminars that were held for students. To mention a few were – Menstrual Hygiene and Management for the girl students , No

Tobacco awareness seminar, Bully Free school for students of grades VI to X, career guidance and counseling for grades IX & X along with parents.

### **Health checkup:**

A team of dedicated doctors from ALEXIS Hospital conducted the camp which included General Physical examination, Dental Check-up, Eye & Ear check-up. Necessary medical advice and precautionary measures were given to all the students.

Days are gone when the students used to stick to their school books and notes to achieve high scores without having exposure to the real-world outside the books. Today, it has become very important for each and every student to get indulged into extra-curricular activities which help them to experience the world they are supposed to live in after completing their education. Hence, it imparts practical knowledge of the outside world to the students through the means of various competitions, making students confident, practical and self-sufficient. These activities not only work as a stress buster but also help the students expand their mental horizons. NCC is one such activity which school students can pursue to add to their learnings and aptitude.

To inculcate the qualities of discipline and patriotism among students we have conducted week long training for our students of grades VI to X from 3<sup>rd</sup> Dec to 10<sup>th</sup> Dec.
